Shaykh Yasir is our Senior Imam and the spiritual architect of our institution. He delivers religious edicts (fatwas) to community members, serves as the guiding light and vision behind all our programming, teaches us our intellectual and spiritual heritage, and represents us with wisdom, sincerity, and steadfastness in the public sphere.

Through his devoted teaching, mentorship, and religious leadership, Shaykh Yasir fosters a love for Islam and strives to inspire a Prophetic ethos in new generations of American Muslims.

Shaykh Yasir has also led ISBCC members on community hikes which revive the Prophetic tradition of reflection and tadabbor - to find Allah (swt) and oneself among His signs in nature.

teamFajr

Part of Shaykh Yasir's vision includes creating a greater reverence for the blessed time surrounding the pre-dawn prayer, Fajr. The ISBCC's teamFajr consists of a group of dedicated aspirants who join together to support one another's efforts to participate in the early morning supplication. The teamFajr experience includes Fajr prayer in congregation, recitation of the Mathurat and Quran together, Duha prayer followed by a communal breakfast.

Seekers of Knowledge

This year, Shaykh Yasir blessed us with knowledge of the traditional Islamic sciences through five courses: Imam Al-Ghazali's Etiquettes of Engaging the Quran, Etiquettes of Seeking Knowledge in the Islamic Tradition, Aqidah (Islamic theology) Intensive, and Aqidah Level 1.

Umrah

The footsteps of the Prophet ﷺ lead to the holy cities of Mecca and Medina. To follow in these footsteps, members of our community joined Shaykh Yasir and the Medina Institute's Ustadh Moutasem Atiya to make the magnificent Umrah.



Office Hours

Twice a week for two hours Shaykh Yasir counsels and provides fatwas to community members, so that they can live their lives in accordance with the pleasure of Allah and His Messenger.

To be with and studying under Shaykh Yasir is to nourish oneself from a beloved teacher who models living Prophetically.

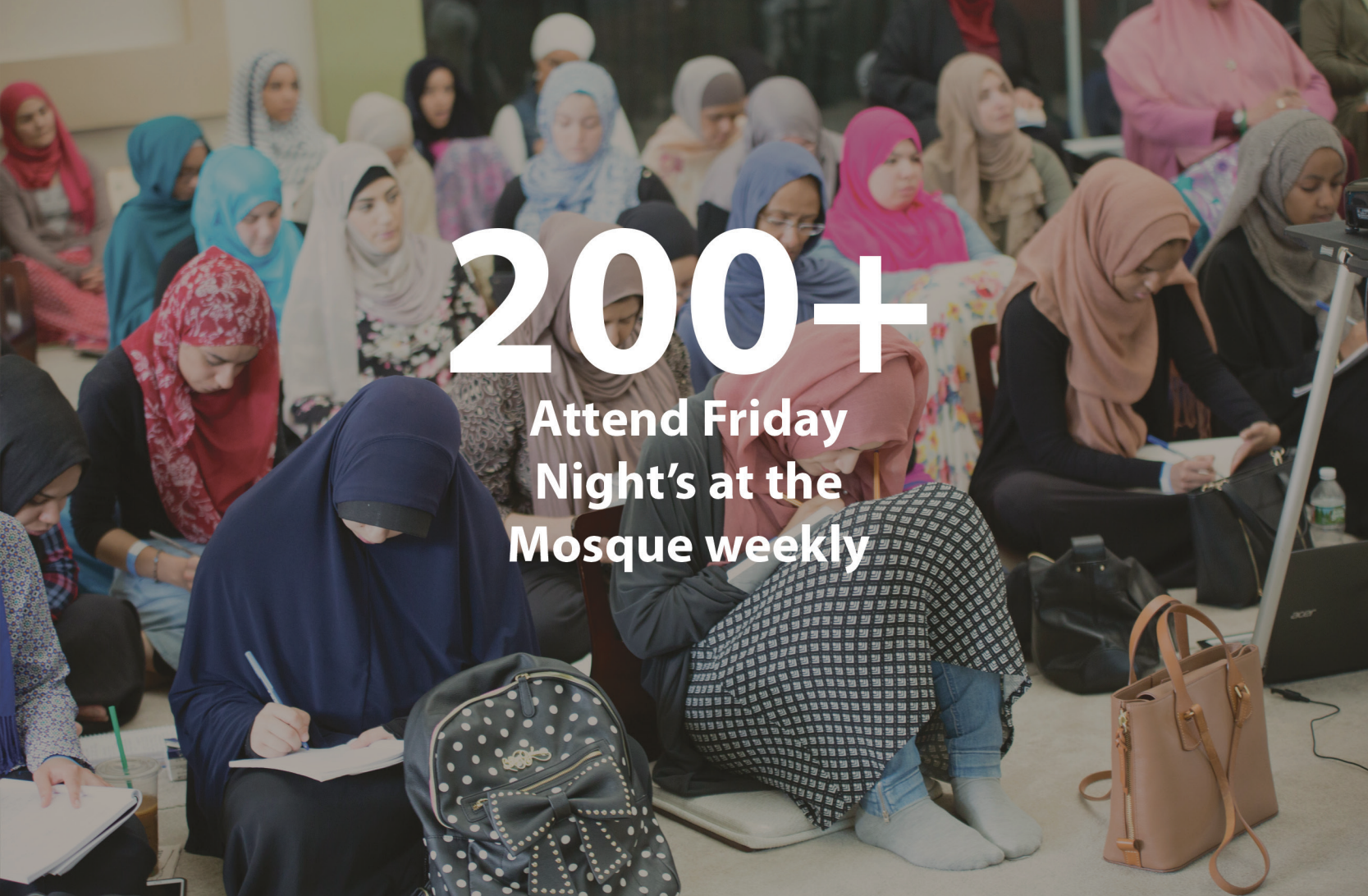
Religious Programming Team

Reciting, memorizing and reflecting on the Speech of Allah is at the core of the Islamic faith and an indispensable part of Living Prophetically. Aside from all its other activities, the fundamental mission of the ISBCC is to help its community to know, to understand, and to live the words revealed to the Prophet ﷺ: the Quran.

As ISBCC's Qari, Imam Mohamed Nabeel connects the community to the Quran by leading us in taraweeh prayers in Ramadan as well as khatms of the Quran throughout the year. In addition, Imam Mohammed leads three programs that encourage a deeper connection with the words of Allah.

Responding to the Challenge of our Time

With the election of the new President, we find ourselves in somewhat of a similar situation to that of the Prophet ﷺ and the Companions: under a constant threat from an outside force. If we are to follow in the footsteps of our Prophet ﷺ, we must be ready to defend our faith and our community at a moment's notice in these conditions, yet understanding that true Prophetic service requires us to serve our fellow neighbors and community members even in the midst of challenges.

As soon as the new President was elected, ISBCC mobilized our allies with the aid of Allah to defend against any threats coming our ways.

At the same time, while keeping our defenses strong, we sought to benefit our neighbors and community members:

Through our Neighbors for Neighbors (N4N) Initiative, we organized monthly clean-up of the mosque neighborhood; we partnered with the city to begin the renovation of the King St. Play Area park and received commitments to upgrade lighting and trash bins in parts of Roxbury.

Through our partnership with GBIO we worked on helping pass CPA (an affordable housing property tax increase) and put our weight behind criminal justice reform issues



Interfaith & Civic Engagement

ISBCC met with the Cardinal, the Governor, the Mayor, and the Massachusetts Board of Rabbis.

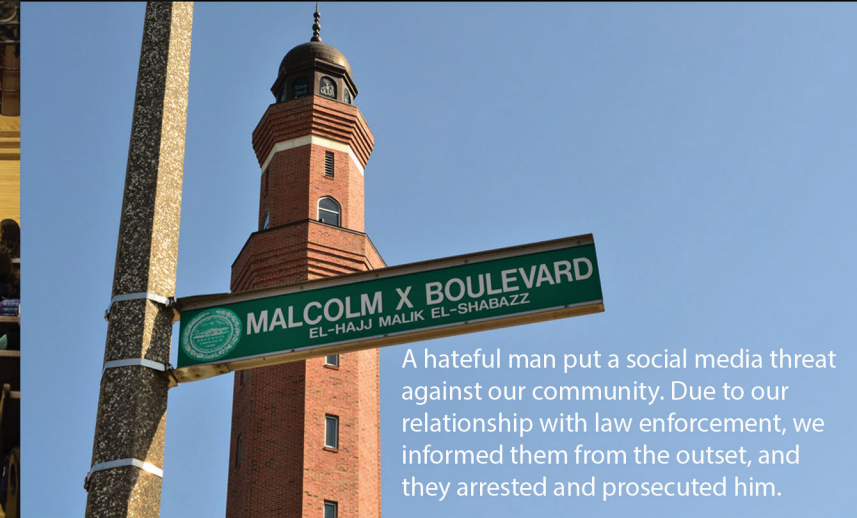

Mr. Robbins was the attorney who represented the other side in the lawsuits brought by the hate group against the ISBCC during its construction.

Tours

The ISBCC tours program seeks to give any of our fellow neighbors, community members, or visitors to Boston a glimpse into Islam and a real life Muslim community. Led by incredibly experienced tour guides, the tour shares the basics of Islam, the history and activities of the center, and answers any questions that the visitors are curious about. At a time when stereotypes are amuck about our faith and Muslims, this program without a doubt is one of our marquee programs and makes a significant impact in changing hearts and minds. Since the election of the Trump administration, we have nearly doubled our number of tours with one literally every day.



Uniting the Ummah

It was with the spirit of this hadith in mind of living prophetically, and upon request from our community, that last year we initiated the first Masajid Collaboration meeting. We have come along way since last year and with a rotating leadership model of 16 mosques, and the support of an ISBCC staff member, have built off our initial successes to have consistent quarterly meetings. The collaboration has produced beautiful fruits culminating in several successful initiatives.

Neighbors for Neighbors

As we all know, taking care of one’s neighbors is an essential part of being a Muslim. Indeed, members of the ISBCC’s community have expressed their concern that we were not doing enough for our neighborhood. Therefore, the ISBCC launched the Neighbors for Neighbors program (N4N) in order to better embody the example set by the Prophet ﷺ. Our efforts to foster a benevolent community have flourished thanks to the vision of Shaykh Yasir, the leadership of Ayesha Kazmi, and the dedication of a team of volunteers. N4N has established key relationships with Boston’s municipal agencies in order to address persistent community concerns, such as the safety of the streets, adequate street lighting, and the cleanup of abandoned lots. In addition, the N4N program has made the following accomplishments:

The Prophet ﷺ recognized the fact that it is very difficult for a person to live prophetically when he or she is struggling just to survive. When any member of the ummah suffers, we all suffer. In order to strengthen our community, we must ensure we ourselves are fit and healthy (not sure if this is correct doctrine). In this spirit, the ISBCC does its utmost to enable community members to obtain the healthcare services they need through its Ummah Health team. To this end, we have collaborated with:

- Health Care For All, a Massachusetts health care advocacy organization
- Harvard Family Van, a nonprofit that parks outside of the mosque and provides free blood pressure screenings
- Neighborhood Health Insurance, to assist community members in getting coverage

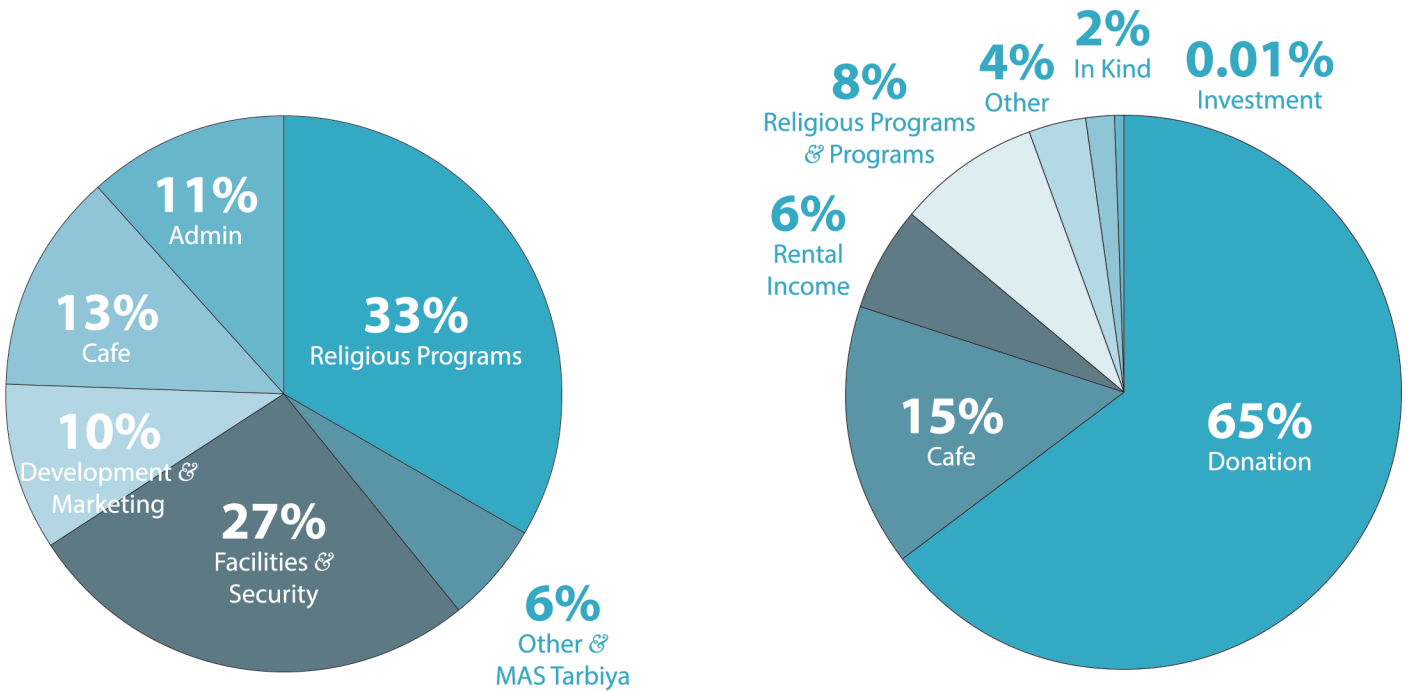
Finances
